THE ASSAM APPROPRIATION (NO.II) ACT, 2011

AN

ACT

to provide for the withdrawal of certain sums from and out of the Consolidated Pund of the State of Assam for the services of the financial year, 2011-2012.

Be it enacted by the Assam Legislative Assembly in the Sixty-second Year of the Republic of India as follows:-

Short title

1. This Act may be called the Assam Appropriation (No.II) Act, 2011.

Withdrawal of Rs.37180,85,83,000 from and out of the Consolidated Fund of the State of Assam for the financial year, 2011-2012

2. From and out of the Consolidated Fund of the State of Assam, there may be withdrawn sums not exceeding those specified in column (3) of the Schedule amounting in the aggregate [inclusive of sums specified in column (3) of Schedule to the Assam Appropriation (Vote on Account) Act, 2011 (Assam Act No.II of 2011)] to the sum of thirty seven thousand one hundred eighty crore, eighty five lakh and eighty three thousand rupees towards defraying the several charges which will come in course of payment during the financial year, 2011-2012 in respect of the services specified in column (2) of the Schedule.

Appropriation

3. The sums authorised to be withdrawn from and out of the Consolidated Fund of the State of Assam by this Act shall be appropriated for the services and purposes expressed in the Schedule in relation to the said year ending on the Thirty-first Day of March, 2012.
