THE ASSAM APPROPRIATION (No.III) ACT, 1973

Act

to authorise payment and appropriation of certain further sums from and out of the Consolidated Fund of the State of Assam to the services of the year ending the thirty-first day of March 1974.

Preamble. Whereas it is expedient to authorise payment and appropriation of certain further sums from and out of the Consolidated Fund of the State of Assam to the year ending the thirty-first day of March, 1974.

It is hereby enacted in the Twenty-fourth Year of the Republic of India as follows:—

Short title and commencement. 1.(1) This Act may be called the Assam Appropriation (No.III) Act, 1973.
(2) It shall come into force at once.

Issue of Rupees ten crores out of the Consolidated Fund of the State of Assam for the year 1973-74. 2. From and out of the Consolidated Fund of the State of Assam, there shall be paid and applied sums not exceeding those specified in column (2) of the Schedule amounting to the sum of Rupees ten crores towards defraying the charges which will come in course of payment during the year ending the 31st day of March, 1974 in respect of the services specified in column (1) of the Schedule.

Appropriation. 3. The sums authorised to be paid and applied from and out of the Consolidated Fund of the State of Assam by this Act shall be appropriated for the services and purposes expressed in the Schedule in relation to the year ending on the 31st day of March, 1974.

4. (1) The Assam Appropriation (No.2) 'Ordinance, 1973 is hereby repealed. Assam Ordinance VII of 1973.

(2) Notwithstanding such repeal, anything done or any action taken under the Ordinance as repealed shall be deemed to have been done or taken under this Act as if this Act had commenced on the twenty-first day of May, 1973 (date of promulgation of the Ordinance).
