An Act

to provide for the withdrawal of certain sums from and out of the Consolidated Fund of the State of Assam to the service of a Part of the financial year ending on the thirty-first day of March, 1973

Be it hereby enacted in the Twenty-third Year of the Republic of India as follows:—

Short title 1. This Act may be called the Assam Appropriation and com-(Vote-on-Account) Act, 1972. The Act shall come mencement into force with effect from 1st April, 1972. Withdrawal

2. From and out of the Consolidated Fund of the of Rs. State of Assam, there may be withdrawn sums out of the Consolidated Schedule amounting in the aggregate to the sum of Fund of the Rupees sixty-six crores fifty-four lakhs ninety-five thou-State of sand three hundred and fifty towards defraying the the financial several charges which will come in course of payyear 1972-73. ment during the period of three months beginning on the first day of April, 1972 in respect of the services specified in column (2) of the Schedule.

Appropriation.

3. The sums authorised to be withdrawn from and out of the Consolidated Fund of the State of Assam by this Act, shall be appropriated for the services and purposes expressed in the Schedule in relation to the year ending on the thirty-first day of March, 1973.
