198. Will the Minister of Higher Education Department be pleased to state :

Whether the Government has any plan for the infrastructural upgradation of the DIET located in Udharbond Legislative Assembly Constituency and whether there is any proposal to develop Udharbond DIET as a Centre of Excellence for teacher education and training in the region ?

Answer:

Hon'ble Minister of Education, Assam Dr. Ranoj Pegu will reply:

Govt. of India during 2023-24 had approved an amount of Rs. 328.69 lakh for Construction of RCC Building of DIET, Cachar, Udharbond under Strengthening of Physical Infrastructure for New Construction and Expansion of existing Teacher Education Institutes (TEIs). The construction is being done by PWD.

Regarding Centre of Excellence (CoE) it may be mentioned that in the 1st Phase during 2023-24 the name of DIET, Cachar was proposed but the Ministry of Education (MoE), Govt. of India (GoI) had not approved the DIET in the meeting of the Project Approval Board (PAB) held on 07-12-2023. PAB had observed that the State had submitted proposal for 5 DIETs but the DIET Cachar was way below the MoE benchmark and was hence not selected. The copy of the minutes of PAB is enclosed at Annexure-A.

The proposal for DIET, Cachar for considering as Centre of Excellence will be submitted in subsequent proposal as per quota subject to assessment of fulfilment of evaluation criteria in the prescribed areas of Govt. of India.

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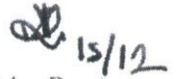

DIETs of Excellence

(Under the aegis of Samagra Shiksha)

Minutes of the meeting of the Project Approval Board held on 7th December, 2023 through Video Conference to consider the Annual Work Plan & Budget (AWP&B) 2023-24 of DIETs of Excellence under Samagra Shiksha.

The meeting of the Project Approval Board for considering the Annual Work Plan and Budget (AWP&B) 2023-24 for DIETs of Excellence under Samagra Shiksha was held under the chairpersonship of Shri Sanjay Kumar, Secretary (SE&L) on 7th December, 2023 through Video Conference. The list of participants who attended the meeting is at **Annexure-I**.

2. At the outset, Secretary (SE&L) welcomed the participants. He recalled that one of the budget announcements for 2023-24 had inter-alia stated that DIETs would be transformed into vibrant institutes of Excellence. In accordance, the department has initiated a proposal for DIETs of Excellence for the upgradation of infrastructure of all functioning DIETs in the country in a phased manner through resource support.

3. Secretary (SE&L) also emphasized that vacancies in the academic/non-academic positions of DIETs need to be filled up in a transparent and time bound manner as talented and qualified human resource is essential to propel these institutes as Centres of Excellence.

3. Joint Secretary (Institutions) briefed about the background process for selection of a DIET to be upgraded as a DIET of Excellence. Initially, a concept of DIETs of excellence (model DIET) was developed in the Department. The major features of a Model DIET are detailed below:

- **Classrooms:** Spacious and well-equipped classrooms with modern teaching aids.
- **Computer Room:** Sufficient computers, high-speed internet connectivity, and access to educational software and digital resources.
- **Library/Resources:** Equipped with a wide range of books, reference materials, textbooks, and digital resources for teachers, students, and researchers, etc.
- **Laboratories:** Equipped with modern apparatus, audio-visual facilities, language learning software, interactive tools, chemicals, and safety equipment to support practical experiments and demonstrations.
- **Seminar Hall (50-seater):** For conferences, workshops, and training programmes.
- **Auditorium (100-seater):** For large scale programmes.
- **Residential Hostel:** Separate for boys and girls for student teachers/teacher trainees
- **Residential Quarters:** Single and family quarters.
- **Smart Classrooms:** Equip with audio-visual aids such as projectors, interactive whiteboards, smart TVs, audio systems, etc.
- **Website:** which would serve as an information hub for the DIET

Thereafter assessment of all existing functional DIETs in the country was done through a Google Form Survey- by taking into account factors such as infrastructure facilities and resources available at each DIET i.e., classrooms, faculty rooms, libraries, laboratories, ICT facilities, residential hostels etc. The criterion for the assessment of DIETs was formulated in terms of programmes conducted, infrastructural facilities and human resources available and weightage given to each indicator. DIETs were requested to self-assess themselves in terms of these indicators and States were requested to submit proposals to close these infrastructural gaps. These proposals were appraised in the Department and DIETs scoring minimum benchmarks of 60 and above were considered for upgradation as Centres of Excellence.

4. With the above background, a detailed presentation for two States i.e., Madhya Pradesh and Haryana was given to apprise states and UTs representatives present in the meeting on the specific interventions under which funds are will be provided under the DIETs of Excellence

scheme. After the detailed presentation in respect of the two States, presentations on the recommendations for the DIETs selected for 2023-24 State/UT wise were taken up. *The state/UT wise decisions taken in the meeting is given below:*

Sl. No.	State/UT	Decision
1.	Andaman Nicobar	- In terms of MoE Benchmarks, DIET South Andaman was found eligible as given in para 6 below. - There is a vacancy of 56% academic pots in DIET South Andaman, UT was urged to fill up the existing vacancies on priority within the next 6 months i.e., June 2024.
2.	Andhra Pradesh	- In terms of MoE Benchmarks, three proposed DIETs were found eligible as given in para 6 below. - Vacancy of academic posts in the three selected DIETs is very high i.e., Srikakulam: 96%; Vizianagaram: 84%; Kurnool: 84%. State informed that surplus teachers are presently being deputed in DIETs and the process of filling the existing vacancies is under process and is expected to be completed by the next two months.
3.	Arunachal Pradesh	- In terms of MoE Benchmarks, two proposed DIETs were found eligible as given in para 6 below. - Vacancy of academic posts in the two selected DIETs is very high i.e., Dairang: 88%; Roing: 88%. State submitted that file for filling of these vacancies have been submitted to the Public Service Commission and the process is expected to be completed within the next six months i.e., June 2024.
4.	Assam	- The state has submitted a proposal for 5 DIETs. However, one DIET i.e., Cachar was way below the MoE benchmark and was not selected. The rest of the DIETs were selected as per para 6 below. - The vacancy of academic posts in the four selected DIETs is- Barpeta: 24%; Dhemaji: 35%; Jorhat: 16%; Kamrup: 16%. The state was urged to liquidate these vacancies on priority.
5.	Bihar	- Six DIETs were reviewed and found eligible for strengthening as Centres of Excellence as given in para 6 below. - There are vacancies of academic posts in the 6 selected DIETs i.e., Aurangabad: 32%; Bhojpur: 4%; Gaya: 40%; Khagaria: 32%; Mujaffarpur: 36%; Samastipur: 28%; Sitamarhi: 28%. State informed that filling up of both academic and para-academic are being expedited.
6.	Chhattisgarh	- In terms of MoE Benchmarks, four DIETs as given in para 6 below were found eligible. - There are vacancies of academic posts in the 4 selected DIETs i.e., Pendra: 36%; Bemetara: 56%; Raipur: 32%;

		Kanker: 68%. State was urged to liquidate these existing vacancies on priority.
7.	Delhi	▪ UT had done its own assessment of eligible DIETs and the two selected DIETs as given in para 6 below were found eligible as per MoE benchmarks. ▪ There are high vacancies of academic posts in the 2 selected DIETs i.e., Motibagh: 44%; Rajinder Nagar: 60%. UT informed that the process is ongoing for filling up of these vacancies.
8.	Gujarat	▪ Six DIETs as given in para 6 below were reviewed and found eligible for strengthening as Centres of Excellence. ▪ There are vacancies of academic posts in the 6 selected DIETs i.e., Anand: 48%; Gandhinagar: 36%; Navsari: 52%; Vadodara: 56%; Surat: 64%; Mehsana: 60%. The state submitted that filling up of 245 academic vacancies is currently under process and will be completed shortly.
9.	Haryana	▪ Out of the 02 proposed DIETs, only one DIET i.e. DIET Karnal was found eligible. The state was urged to upgrade existing DIETs upto the MoE benchmarks and come up with more proposals for the next year. ▪ While the overall vacancy of academic posts in the DIETs of Haryana is 57.71%, it is 48% in DIET Karnal. State was urged to liquidate these existing vacancies on priority.
10.	Himachal Pradesh	▪ State has done its own assessment and submitted the proposal of 2 DIETs but one of the DIET was not found eligible as per MoE benchmarks. It was informed that the state can submit an additional proposal within a week's time for an alternate DIET for the supplementary PAB. ▪ While the overall vacancy of academic posts in the DIETs of Himachal Pradesh is 35.76%, it is 20% in DIET Shimla. The state was urged to liquidate these existing vacancies on priority.
11.	Jammu & Kashmir	▪ UT is eligible for two DIETs as per MoE benchmark but only one proposal i.e., DIET Kulgam was found eligible. It was informed that UT can submit an additional proposal within a week's time for an alternate DIET for the supplementary PAB. ▪ While the overall vacancy of academic posts in the DIETs of Jammu & Kashmir is 47.60%, it is 72% in DIET Kulgam. UT was urged to liquidate these vacancies on priority.
12.	Jharkhand	▪ Five DIETs as given in para 6 below were reviewed and found eligible for strengthening as Centres of Excellence as per the MoE benchmarks. Additional proposals for DIET Koderma will be shared by the state for the supplementary PAB. ▪ There are very high vacancies of academic posts in the 5 selected DIETs i.e., Bokaro: 76%; East Singhbhum: 76%;

		Godda: 80%; Palamu: 80%; Giridih: 84%. The state submitted that the process for filling these vacancies have been initiated and will be completed by June 2024.
13.	Karnataka	- The state has submitted proposals for 6 DIETs but one of the DIET (Belagavi) was not found eligible as per MoE benchmarks. It was informed that state can submit an additional proposal within a week's time for an alternate DIET for the supplementary PAB. Rest of the DIETs were approved as per para 6 below. - There are vacancies of academic posts in the 4 of the 5 DIETs selected i.e., Bellary: 32%; Bidar: 48%; Chitradurga: 48%; Mysore & Shimoga: No Vacancy. The state was urged to liquidate these remaining vacancies on priority within the next 6 months.
14.	Kerala	- The three proposed DIETs as given in para 6 below were found eligible as per the MoE benchmarks. - There are vacancies of academic posts in the 3 DIETs selected i.e., Thrissur: 60%; Palakkad: 60%; Idukki: 68%. The state informed that presently academic staff are on deputation in the DIETs and recruitment is under process.
15.	Ladakh	- DIET Leh as given in para 6 below was found eligible as per the MoE benchmarks. - There is a vacancy of 80% academic pots in DIET Leh, UT was urged to fill up the existing vacancies on priority within the next 6 months i.e., June 2024.
16.	Madhya Pradesh	- State has submitted proposals for 8 DIETs. The proposal was approved as per details given in para 6 below which were found eligible as per the MoE benchmarks. - There are high vacancies of academic posts in the 8 DIETs selected i.e., Gwalior: 40%; Jabalpur: 44%; Bhopal: 48%; Khandwa: 60%; Mandsaur: 84%; Sagar: 56%; Rewa: 32%; Sehore: 52%. The state informed that approval has been given by the state government to fill up these vacancies and proposals have been initiated for filling of these vacancies.
17.	Maharashtra	- Six DIETs as given in para 6 below were reviewed and found eligible for strengthening as Centres of Excellence . - There are very high vacancies of academic posts in the 6 DIETs selected i.e., Dharashiv: 60%; Nandurbar: 68%; Amravati: 72%; Nanded: 60%; Washim: 72%; Wardha: 76%. State was urged to liquidate these remaining vacancies on priority within the next 6 months.
18.	Manipur	State had submitted proposals for two DIETs, of which only one DIET Imphal East as given in para 6 below was found eligible. It was informed that the State can submit an additional proposal for the eligible DIET Keikol within a week's time for the supplementary PAB.

		While the overall vacancy of academic posts in the DIETs of Manipur is 60.89%, it is 32% in DIET Imphal East. The state was urged to liquidate these vacancies on priority within the next 6 months.
19.	Mizoram	- The two selected DIETs as given in para 6 below were found eligible as per the MoE benchmarks. - There are vacancies of academic posts in the 2 DIETs selected i.e., Aizawl: 28%; Mamit: 48%. The state was urged to come up with a strategy for liquidating these existing vacancies on priority within the next 6 months.
20.	Nagaland	- Two DIETs as given in para 6 below were found eligible as per the MoE benchmarks. State's request for resubmitting a modified proposal for these two DIETs, since it had reportedly missed out on major interventions such as VE lab, was accepted and it was informed to come back with the revised proposal within a week's time. - There are vacancies of academic posts in the 2 DIETs selected i.e., Kohima: 28% and Dimapur: 32%. State was urged to come up with a strategy for liquidating these existing vacancies on priority within the next 6 months.
21.	Odisha	- Seven DIETs as given in para 6 below were reviewed and found eligible for strengthening as Centres of Excellence as per the MoE benchmarks. - There are high to very high vacancies of academic posts in some of the 7 DIETs selected i.e., Ganjam: 28%; Jagtasinghpur: 44%; Jharsuguda: 72%; Mayurbhanj: 16%; Nawarangpur: 64%; Dhenkanal: 52%; Sambalpur: 56%. State informed that filling up of vacancies of teacher educators in DIETs has been completed and the process is ongoing for the SCERT.
22.	Puducherry	- DIET Puducherry as given in para 6 below was found eligible as per the MoE benchmarks. - There is a vacancy of 36% academic posts in DIET Puducherry, UT was urged to fill up the existing vacancies on priority within the next 6 months i.e., June 2024.
23.	Punjab	- The state had submitted the proposal of 3 DIETs, which were found eligible as per the MoE benchmarks. Details are given in para 6 below. - There are very high vacancies of academic posts in the 3 DIETs selected i.e., Ferozpur: 88%; Ludhiana: 96%; Rupnagar: 96%. State submitted that process of filling up these existing vacancies have been initiated and is expected to be completed within the next 6 months.
24.	Rajasthan	State submitted proposals for 6 DIETs, out of which 5 DIETs were found eligible as per the MoE benchmarks.



		There are very high vacancies of academic posts in the 5 DIETs selected i.e., Alwar: 32%; Udaipur: 24%; Churu: 24%; Jodhpur: 8%; Bikaner: 8%; Jaipur: 8%. The state informed that a request has been sent to the state government to fill up these vacancies and has been taken up on priority.
25.	Sikkim	- DIET Gangtok as given in para 6 below was found eligible as per the MoE benchmarks. - There is a vacancy of 52% in DIET Gangtok. The state informed that the process of filling these existing vacancies is under process and has been taken up on priority.
26.	Tamil Nadu	- The state has submitted a proposal for 6 DIETs that are eligible as per MoE benchmarks. These were approved as per para 6 below. - There are high vacancies of academic posts in the 6 DIETs selected i.e., Erode: 52%; Madurai: 28%; Pudukottai: 36%; Salem: 20%; Tiruchirappalli: 24%; Tirunelveli: 52%. State informed that process has been initiated for filling of these existing vacancies through direct recruitment.
27.	Telangana	- Both the DIETs as given in para 6 below were found eligible as per the MoE benchmarks. - There are high vacancies of academic posts in the 2 DIETs selected i.e., Mahabubnagar: 44%; Khamman: 52%. State informed that the process of filling of these existing vacancies is under process and will be taken up on priority.
28.	Uttar Pradesh	13 DIETs as given in para 6 below were reviewed and found eligible for strengthening as Centres of Excellence. - There are vacancies of academic posts in the 13 DIETs selected i.e., Lucknow: 12%; Varanasi: 8%; Jaunpur: 24%; Meerut: 28%; Aligarh: 36%; Gorakhpur: 28%; Moradabad: 44%; Mujaffarnagar: 24%; Agra: 40%; Barabanki: 28%; Kanpur: 28%; Kushinagar: 52%; Prayagraj: 12%. The state informed that the process of filling these vacancies is under process on priority.
29.	Uttarakhand	5 DIETs as given in para 6 below were reviewed and found eligible for strengthening as Centres of Excellence as per the MoE benchmarks. - There are vacancies of academic posts in the 5 DIETs selected i.e., Dehradun: 28%; Haridwar: 36%; Pauri: 32%; Nainital: 44%; US Nagar: 56%. The state informed that the process of filling these existing vacancies is under process and will be taken up on priority.
30.	West Bengal	- The state has submitted proposals for 4 DIETs as given in para 6 below which were found eligible as per the MoE benchmarks. - There are very high vacancies of academic posts in the 5 DIETs selected i.e., Hooghly: 88%; Malda: 80%; Purulia: 84%; Uttar Dinajpur: 84%. State informed that the process

		of filling of these existing vacancies is under process and has been taken up on priority.
31.	Goa	The proposal of the State is not as per the intervention of the scheme and as such not accepted. State was informed to revise the proposal and submit within a week's time for the supplementary PAB.
32.	Meghalaya	The proposal for DIET Sohra, East Khasi Hills is for establishment of a new DIET while the scheme is for strengthening of existing DIET as a centre of excellence and not for setting up a new establishment. Hence, the proposal was not accepted. State was informed to revise the proposal accordingly and re-submit within a week's time for the supplementary PAB.
34.	Tripura	- State had submitted the proposal of DIET Kakraban, Gomati. However, DIET Gomati has obtained a score of 48.50 as per MoE benchmarks and is not eligible. - It was informed that the state can submit an additional proposal as a replacement within a week's time for an eligible DIET as per MoE benchmark for the supplementary PAB.

5. **Major Actionable Points:** Secretary (SE&L) underlined the following actionable points at the end of the meeting:

- 1) All states/UTs to prepare detailed DIET-wise chart indicating intervention wise major milestones to be achieved, along with timelines, as per PAB approvals and submit the same to MoE within the next two weeks.
- 2) All vacancies in DIETs of Excellence are to be filled on priority within the next 6 months i.e., by 30th June 2024. Further, the subsequent release of funds for a particular DIET will be contingent upon the filing of existing vacancies, particularly academic positions.
- 3) A central team will be conducting on-site visits for review/verification of a few random list DIETs in each state/UT details of which will be communicated in due course.
- 4) Funds for DIET of Excellence will be disbursed through the PAB for Samagra Shiksha scheme subject to the specific DIET showing actual progress on the DIETs of Excellence Milestones chart.
- 5) Online mechanism for self-uploading as per MoE Online Monitoring System will be shared with all states/UTs. Stringent monitoring will be done centrally on the progress against projected milestones as per DIET specific chart.
- 6) With the focus of National Education Policy 2020 on integration of Vocational Education (VE) in schools, each state/UT may ensure that one of the laboratories sanctioned is for VE. This will further facilitate the promotion of exposure to VE in schools starting from the Upper Primary level i.e., Class 6.

With reference to the Govt. of India letter under reference on the subject cited above, I have the honour to inform that recently the Department of School Education carried out an online survey of DIETs to gauge present status of infrastructure in terms of HR, building, classroom and toilet facilities, library facilities, ICT facilities, hostel facilities and residential facilities etc. Result of the survey revealed that some of the common challenges faced by DIETs throughout the country related to Human Resources- vacancies in various positions, inadequate physical infrastructure, insufficient funding, lack of modern technology integration, limited research and development, facilities, inadequate library resources, lack of convergence and linkages with higher education institution, etc. Considering the Budget Announcement, GOI Department of School education and Literacy has developed a Concept note on Empowering DIETs as centre of excellent (Model DIETs). A Model DIET has appropriate infrastructure and resource support; empowered teachers through continuous professional development, research and evidence based practices, support inclusive education and fosters collaboration among educational institutions, community organizations and industry, etc.

MoE, GOI has planned to provide financial assistance to 613 functional DIET in the country including all the 23 functional DIETs of Assam within a period of 5 years. . The numbers of DIETs of Assam to be covered per year shown below.

d) Identification and Selection Process for converting all the functional DIETs into DIET of Excellence:

- Comprehensive base-line assessment of all existing functional DIETs in the country, considering factors such as infrastructure facilities and resources available at each DIET. These include: classrooms, libraries, laboratories, ICT facilities, and residential hostels etc. DIETs with better infrastructure and resources will be prioritized for transformation. This has been done through a Google form, analysis of which is annexed.
- Involve stakeholders, such as education experts, government officials, and representatives from educational institutions, to provide valuable insights and ensure a collaborative approach. Expert Committee was set up for this task, which has given its recommendations, which are incorporated into report.
- Based on the above, minimum benchmark for selection is to be established. Accordingly, it has been decided that **only DIETS scoring 60 and above points may be considered in for upgradation.** *This implies that the status of any DIET must reach this bench-mark level, through State interventions, before it can be considered for upgradation through these funds.* The minimum benchmarks established will allow for a gradual and systematic transformation process, ensuring that only those institutions with adequate resources are selected.
