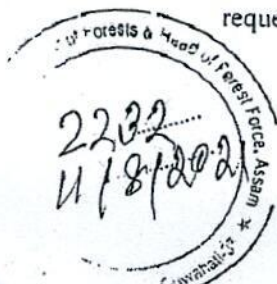

Annexure - II

AGREEMENT EXECUTED UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF
THE ASSAM FOREST REGULATION (VII) OF 1891
AND
THE RULES FRAMED BY THE GOVT. OF ASSAM THEREUNDER.

Page No. 1

This agreement is for the permission of collection and removal of Stones from the Rakshyashini P.B.F. quarry No. 2 of Goalpara Forest Division for supplying to Bangladesh by the Assam Mineral Development Corporation Ltd. The operation period of the quarry shall be for 5 years from 1.3.95 to 28.2.2000 subject to variation in collection/removal of materials as required from time to time.

This agreement is made between the Chief Conservator of Forests(I), Assam on behalf of the Government of Assam on the one part and the Managing Director, Assam Mineral Development Corporation Ltd. on the other part, whereby it is agreed on the basis of Govt. letter No. FRS.24/90/75, dtd. 15.3.95 regarding the removal of Boulders/Stones/quarry dust etc. from the leased out area of the Forest Department, Assam in connection with the supply of Boulders to Bangladesh as per the following stipulations:

1. Assam Mineral Development Corporation Ltd. has made a request for leasing out Rakshyashini stone quarry No. 2 for collection and removal of stone under Goalpara Division for the purpose as stated above.

2. The Chief Conservator of Forests(I), Assam on getting Forest Clearance from Government of India and then from Government of Assam agreed to leased out the Rakshyashini stone quarry No. 2 to A.M.D.C. Ltd.

3. The Assam Mineral Development Corporation Ltd. shall pay the value of the stone at the prevailing rate of royalty and A.P. tax, Income tax etc. as required and shall pay the enhanced rate of royalty as and when revision takes place during the lease period. The present rate of royalty of Boulders is Rs. 10 per cu. m.

4. The Assam Mineral Development Corporation Ltd. shall place their demand for collection and removal of Boulders in advance alongwith the price payable for the materials before commencing the quarrying operations.

5. The Assam Mineral Development Corporation Ltd. shall have no right to remove any forest materials without any prior permission of the Forest Department and also will have to work in conformity with the general direction of the concerned Divisional Forest Officer as regards planning operation of the area.

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Annexure - II

6. The Assam Mineral Development Corporation shall be permitted to construct the following temporary accommodation within the quarry areas during the currency of leased period of the quarry.

- (a) One Nitro compound Magazine building of 10 M.T. capacity.
- (b) One Detonator Magazine building of 2000 Nos. capacity.
- (c) Temporary accommodation for Security Guards required for guarding the buildings at (a) and (b) above.
- (d) Temporary accommodation for the personnel directly related with quarrying operations. Construction of Magazine buildings at (a) & (b) above shall be subject to observing and obtaining necessary clearance of all the required formalities.

7. Assam Mineral Development Corporation shall be permitted during the currency of the leased period of quarry to make use of only 20 hac. of land inclusive of the quarry areas for the purpose of installing the crushing plant and stacking of boulders extracted from the Rakshyashini quarry. Locations and other details of different temporary buildings and land plots as described above in para 6 & 7 will have to tally with the plans submitted earlier along with the project proposal. The boundary description of the quarry area is as follows :

North	-	Goalpara-Matia F.W.D. Road and Rakshyashini F.R.F. boundary.
South	-	Rakshyashini F.R.F.
East	-	Goalpara - Matia F.W.D. Road.
West	-	Rakshyashini F.R.F.

8. Assam Mineral Development Corporation shall abide by the departmental rules and regulations in respect of movement/control of boulders to be extracted from the above mentioned quarry within the pendancy of the lease periods as per the general direction of the concerned Divisional Forest Officer. No movement of boulders shall be allowed after sun set and before sun rise from the quarry area.

10. The lease period will be for 5 (five) years with effect from 01.08.95. Page N

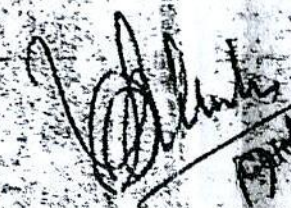
11. The Assam Mineral Development Corporation will supply fuel to the labourers so that there is no damage to the adjoining forest areas.

Sir,

With reference to the subject cited above we the undersigned have the honour to state the following facts and circumstances for favour of your kind consideration.

- 1) By searching the google map it was found that the "C" block is located just behind the "A" & "B" block.
- 2) Large number of illegal encroachers has encroached the areas and it is suspected that these people are involved in illegal mining of the granite rock.
- 3) As already mentioned in the previous report that some portion of "C" block has already been damaged by these encroachers.
- 4) It may be mentioned that behind the "A" & "B" block it will be difficult to look after these illegal mining doing by the encroachers on regular basis.
- 5) Under these circumstances, a portion of the hill measuring of about 1.00 (one) hectare of "C" block may be allowed for mining without using explosives. Manual mining using some chemicals will not affect the entire granite deposit of Rakyashini Hills PRF.

This is for your information and necessary action.
