CHAPTER- I

Grant No.44

Transformation & Development Department

The Departmentally Related Standing Committee on Development (D) Departments took Grant No. 44 incorporated in the Budget which was presented to the House on 10th July, 2026 for the Financial Year, 2026-27 for consideration.

The Departmentally Related Standing Committee on Development (D) Departments has made this Report incorporating all the facts and data given in the Budget and Preliminary Status Paper furnished by the Transformation & Development Department which are briefly focused as follows-

1.1. While examining the papers and documents, as received from the concerned Department in respect of Grant No. 44 and the budget provision made thereto, the Departmentally Related Standing Committee on Development (D) Departments held the said meeting on 16th July, 2026 and took oral evidence from the Departmental representatives for discussing all the points raised by the Hon'ble Members of the Committee.

This will be the Second Report for the Grant No. 44 for the Department concerned.

The Budget provision made under Grant No.44 relating to Transformation & Development Department for the financial year 2026-27 is as given under:

The Committee examined the Major Head of Grant No. 44 and took oral evidence from the Transformation & Development Departmental representatives. The Transformation & Development Department under Grant No.44 comprises/incorporates various schemes taken by the Department for the financial year 2026-27.

CHAPTER- II

The Transformation & Development Department has furnished the Preliminary Status and other relevant information relating to Grant No. 44, which are briefly presented below:

2.1 Brief Note of Grant Nos. 44

Grant No. 44 pertaining to Transformation & Development Department, basically deal with Schemes under Ministry of Development of North Eastern Region (MDoNER), New Delhi & North Eastern Council (NEC), Shillong, Government of India implemented by concerned line departments of Govt. of Assam.

T&D Deptt. Facilitates the line department/IAs in scheme selection, release of fund from MDoNER/NEC. T&D Deptt. does not implement any of the schemes under Grant No. 44.

From 2017 onwards all the Schemes implemented under MDoNER and in FY: 2020-21 NEC has become Central Sector Schemes with 100% funding from Govt. of India. Funds under MDoNER and NEC have been released by Ministry through Central Nodal Agency-NEDFi to vendors via Implementing Agency of State Govt.

The following are the schemes that are being coordinated by T&D Deptt. between MDoNER/NEC and implementing Deptt. for which budget has been required from the State:

- (i) NESIDS OTRI (including earlier NLCPR)
- (ii) Special Development Packages SDP (BTC MoS 2020 & KAATC MoS 2021)
ULFA MoS, 2023, DNLA MoS 2023, Adivasi MoS 2022).
- (iii) Schemes of NEC are funded by NEC, Shillong.

- (i) NESIDS OTRI (including earlier NLCPR):

The Non Lapsable Central Pool of Resources (NLCPR) Scheme came into existence in 1998 under then Planning Commission. Subsequently, it was transferred to DoNER in 2001. The objective of NLCPR Scheme is to fill up the gap in infrastructure sector of the North Eastern Region through sanctioning the projects prioritized by the State Governments at a ratio of 90:10, i.e., 90% Central Share and 10% State share.

After discontinuation of NLCPR in 2017, **North East Special Infrastructure Development Scheme (NESIDS)** a Central Sector Scheme fully funded by the Government of India, was approved with a broad objective to ensure focused development of North East Region by providing financial assistance for projects of (a) physical infrastructure relating to water supply, power, connectivity and specially the projects promoting tourism and (b) social sector for creation of infrastructure in the areas of primary and secondary sectors of education and health.

- (ii) **Special Development Packages SDP (KAATC MoS 2011):** The Memorandum of Settlement (MoS) for Karbi Anglong Autonomous Territorial Council (KAATC) was signed in 2011. The MoS was signed between the Government of India, the Government of Assam and the United People's Democratic Solidarity (UPDS). The MoS provided a Special Economic Package of Rs. 350 crore to the KAATC.

- (iii) **Scheme of NEC:** The North Eastern Council is the nodal agency for the economic and social development of the North Eastern Region which consists of the eight States of Arunachal Pradesh, Assam, Manipur, Meghalaya, Mizoram, Nagaland, Sikkim and Tripura. The North Eastern Council was constituted in 1971 by an Act of Parliament in respect of socio-economic development and balanced development of the North Eastern Area and started functioning in the year 1972. Priority funding areas identified by NEC are Tertiary Education, Tertiary Health, Bamboo, Regional Tourism, Livelihoods. Organic NER, Handloom, Handicrafts & Horticulture, Clean& Green NER, Food Processing and Entrepreneurship etc. schemes under NEC are implemented by concerned line departments of govt. of Assam.

2.2 Performance Budget/Annual Report of the Report of 2024-25:

- Allocations against the schemes are provided by MDoNER.
- Based on the allocation, projects are being selected under each scheme and sent to MDoNER for approval.

OBSERVATIONS AND RECOMMENDATION

Grant no. 44

After a great deal of careful consideration of the papers/documents submitted by the Transport Department and clarification made by the Departmental representatives during the course of tendering their oral evidence the Departmentally Related Standing Committee (DRSC) on Development (D) Departments has made the following Observations and Recommendations.

The Committee noted that the Transformation and Development Department has been entrusted with the responsibility of coordinating with the Ministry of Development of North Eastern Region (MDoNER), the North Eastern Council (NEC), and other concerned agencies for conducting physical inspections, organizing workshops, and facilitating meetings with Hon'ble Union Ministers. The Committee further observed that no specific budget provision has been made to meet the expenditure incurred in carrying out these responsibilities.

The Committee, therefore, recommends that the Government make adequate budgetary provision under the appropriate Head of Account to enable the Department to discharge its assigned responsibilities effectively and efficiently.

The Committee observed with concern that a substantial number of senior level posts in the Transformation and Development Department remain vacant. The Committee is of the view that these vacancies are adversely affecting the efficient functioning of the Department, particularly in the implementation, supervision, and monitoring of developmental programmes at the district level.

The Committee, therefore, recommends that the vacant senior-level posts be filled up on priority through promotion or other appropriate means at the earliest to ensure smooth functioning of the Department and effective implementation of developmental programmes.

With these observations and recommendations as mentioned aforesaid, the Committee recommends that the Budget provision amounting to Rs. 1247.00 Lakh during the financial year 2026-27 under the Grant No. 44 be accepted.

The Action taken on the report may be submitted to the Committee within 90 (ninety) days from the date of presentation of the Report to the House.

4) **Brief Note in respect of Grants No. 45**

Budget Grant No. 45 is estimated to meet the expenditure of the Directorate of Economics and Statistics, Assam under Transformation and Development Department for administration of Census, Surveys and Statistics. The main Major Head of Accounts under Grant No.45 are 3454, 4059 and 5475. The Budget Estimate is made under this Grant No. 45 basically for payment of Salaries of the employees, Travelling Expenses, Offices Expenses, etc. including a few amounts for Capital Outlay like construction, modification, renovation and maintenance of office building and fixed assets.

No fund is allotted under Grant No. 45 for implementation of developmental activities.

Action taken Report on DRSC on Development (D) Departments for 2025-26 against Grant No. 45 on its First Report.

(As received from Transformation & Development Department)

As per the observations and recommendation of the DRSC, Transformation & Development Department has already been sanctioned an amount of Rs.20.00 lakh from Untied Fund Scheme for "Renovation of Bishnu Rabha Auditorium at Boko" vide sanction letter No. FS/14_2024-25(I)_356 dated 21-03-2025 through office of the Deputy Commissioner, Kamrup, Amingaon (Copy enclosed at Annexure-A).

Accordingly, for completion of the remaining works of the "Renovation of Bishnu Rabha Auditorium at Boko", this department has been communicating to the District Commissioner, Kamrup, Amingaon to submit the Utilization Certificate of the previous released amount of Rs.20.00 lakh along with plan and estimate as per this department letter ECF. No. 6639960/7 dated 17-06-2025 (Copy at Annexure-B) and followed by reminder ECF. No.663960/09 dated 28-01-2026 (Copy enclosed at Annexure-C) so that this department can release additional fund to complete the "Renovation of Bishnu Rabha Auditorium at Boko". No replies have been submitted by the District Commissioner, Kamrup, Amingaon as on date.

This department has been continuously kept in touch with the District Commissioner, Kamrup, Amingaon to resolve the matter.

Further, it is be mentioned here that there is no scheme under Grant No.45 to sanction fund for "Renovation of Bishnu Rabha Auditorium at Boko" and released from Untied Fund Scheme of Grant No.-11.

OBSERVATIONS AND RECOMMENDATION

Grant no. 45

After a great deal of careful consideration of the papers/documents submitted by the Transformation & Development Department and clarification made by the Departmental representatives during the course of tendering their oral evidence the Departmentally Related Standing Committee (DRSC) on Development (D) Departments has made the following Observations and Recommendations.

The Committee observed that regular field visits by departmental officers are essential for the collection of primary and secondary data, monitoring developmental activities, and ensuring effective planning and implementation of schemes under Grant No. 45. The Committee also noted that the existing budget provision is inadequate to undertake such field visits on a regular basis.

The Committee, therefore, recommends that adequate funds be provided to the Transformation and Development Department to facilitate regular field visits, data collection, monitoring, and evaluation of developmental programmes across the State.

With these observations and recommendations as mentioned aforesaid, the Committee recommends that the Budget provision amounting to Rs. 4923.43 Lakh during the financial year 2026-27 under the Grant No. 45 be accepted.
