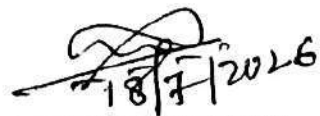
INTRODUCTION

CHAPTER-1 REPORT

Grant No. 11 (Implementation of Assam Accord Department)

Recent Status Report and Brief Report on Grant No. 11 relating to the Implementation of Assam Accord Department

The **Implementation of Assam Accord Department** is responsible for monitoring the implementation of various clauses of the Assam Accord. The actual implementation of these clauses is carried out by the concerned Departments/Organizations of the Government of India and the Government of Assam, as entrusted from time to time.

The Department also serves as the nodal agency for liaison and coordination with the **All Assam Students' Union (AASU)**, the concerned Departments of the Government of India, and the Departments/Organizations of the Government of Assam involved in the implementation of the Assam Accord.

The Department has **no Directorate or subordinate offices** under its administrative control. Further, it does not implement any scheme directly and, therefore, has no independent physical or financial targets.

1	The Committee observes that Swahid Divas is being celebrated on 10 th December every year centrally. In addition to it, the Committee Recommends that Swahid Divas may also be celebrated District-wise to boost the patriotism of Assamese people and remember the martyrs of Assam.	The Implementation of Assam Accord (IAA) Department has issued instructions to the General Administration Department (GAD), Dispur for organizing district-level celebrations of Swahid Divas on 10 th of December every year. 2.	The Committee observes that there is no separate Directorate of Assam Accord Department. Therefore, the Committee recommends to constitute a separate Directorate of the Assam Accord Department. 3	The Committee observes that measures should be undertaken to instill a sense of patriotism amongst all, irrespective of age.	The IAA Department has issued a directive to the Director, Directorate of Information and Public Relations (DIPR), Assam, for the preparation of short documentary films on the Assam Agitation. (Ref: Letter No. ECF No. 619573/31 dated 27/06/2025). Necessary expenditure will be borne by IAA Department.

	Therefore, the Committee has proposed for making a series of short films maximum 30 minutes duration in the documentary film format on various historical milestones, events, acts of heroism and patriotism etc. that occurred during the historical Assam Agitation (1979–1985). These short documentary films can be shown to the young school students in both urban and rural areas so that a sense of patriotism as well as awareness of our glorious past is rekindled in the hearts of the people especially the youth.	
4	The Committee observed that to make a series of short films on this subject will require adequate budgetary support and as such budgetary support of the department may be enhanced. The fund will also be required for organization of Editors' Meet/Film Makers Meet/Script Writers to seed the idea of importance of Assam Agitation and also curate the mind of the film makers to start with.	The department will take necessary steps to ensure adequate budgetary support for such expenditure as per requirement.
5	The Committee observed that while the Department has one vehicle available, there are currently no drivers assigned. Hence, the Committee recommends that the Department may take necessary steps to facilitate the provision of two nos. of drivers and an additional vehicle for the Assam Accord Department.	The IAA Department has written to the General Administration Department (GAD), Dispur requesting placement of a driver for the vehicle of the Department. (1) Payment of Ex-Gratia to victims of Assam Agitation:-

1. One time Ex-gratia payment to the next of kins of Martyrs of Assam Agitation @ 5.00(L) each to paid of 808 Nos out of total Martyrs 860 Nos. of Martyr's and rest are not traceable by the Department. Total unpaid 52 Nos.(Including not traceable/double entry etc)
2. One time Ex-gratia payment to Bullet Injured persons/NoK of Assam Agitation @ 2.00(L) each to paid 428 Nos out of 460 Nos. Bullet Injured. Total unpaid=42 Nos. (including Not Traceable/Double entry etc)
3. One time Ex-gratia payment to Seriously Injured persons/NoK of Assam Agitation @2.00(L) each to paid 270 Nos out of 288 Nos.of Seriously Injured Persons, Total unpaid 17 Nos.(including not traceable/double entry etc)
4. One time Ex-gratia payment to Women Victims/NoK of Assam Agitation @ 2.00(L) each to Paid to 48 Nos. out of 57 Nos. of Women victims, Total unpaid-9 Nos. (including not traceable /double entry etc)

(2) Observation of Swahid Divas by IAA Department

The Implementation of Assam Accord (IAA) Department has been observing Swahid Divas centrally at Paschim Boragaon, Guwahati since 2016 with various programmes aimed at mobilization of Swahid families.

From 2025 onwards, Swahid Divas is also being observed at District and Co-district levels in collaboration with the Department of Cultural Affairs and District Authorities.

(3) Status report on Implementation of Assam Accord

Foreigners Issue:

Clause:

- 5.1 *For purposes of detection and deletion of foreigners, 1.1.1966 shall be the base date and year.*
- 5.2 *All persons who came to Assam prior to 1.1.1966, including those amongst them whose name appeared on the electoral rolls used in 1967 elections, shall be regularized.*

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- 5.3 *Foreigners who came to Assam after 1.1.1966 (inclusive) and upto 24th March, 1971 shall be detected in accordance with the provisions of the Foreigners Act, 1946 and the Foreigners (Tribunals) Order 1964.*
- 5.4 *Names of Foreigners so detected will be deleted from the electoral rolls in force. Such persons will be required to register themselves before the Registration Officers of the respective districts in accordance with the provisions of the Registration of Foreigners Act, 1939 and the Registration of Foreigners Rules, 1939.*
- 5.5 *For this purpose, Government of India will undertake suitable strengthening of the governmental machinery.*
- 5.6 *On the expiry of a period of ten year following the date of detection, the names of all such persons which have been deleted from the electoral rolls shall be restored.*
- 5.7 *All persons who were expelled, earlier, but have since re-entered illegally into Assam, shall be expelled.*
- 5.8 *Foreigners who came to Assam on or after March 25, 1971 shall continue to be detected, deleted and expelled in accordance with law. Immediate and practical steps shall be taken to expel such foreigners.*
- 5.9 *The Government will give due consideration to certain difficulties expressed by the AASU/AAGSP regarding the implementation of the Illegal Migrants (Determination by Tribunals) Act, 1983.*

Action taken: Action Taken Report enclosed at Annexure-I

Clause 6: *Constitutional, legislative and administrative safeguards, as may be appropriate, shall be provided to protect, preserve and promote the cultural, social, linguistic identity and heritage of the Assamese people.*

Action taken:

A number of actions have been taken under this clause so far which include the following:

- (1) The Srimanta Sankaradeva Kalakshetra Society was established under clause 6 of the historic Assam Accord and committed to work for preservation, promotion and upliftment of culture of the people of Assam.

For the construction of the complex, the Ministry of H.R.D. Govt. of India funded Rs. 18.85 crores and Govt. of Assam funded Rs. 1.50 crores the total construction cost being 20.35 crores. The total area of the campus is 10.28 hectares at Panjabari, Guwahati. On 9th November, 1998 the then his Excellency President of India K.R. Narayanan bestowed the Srimanta Sankaradeva Kalakshetra to the Nation.

- (2) Modernization and up gradation scheme of Jyoti Chitraban Films Studio Society was started in the year 1998 under the Centrally sponsored scheme by Govt. of India under Clause VI of Assam Accord. The phase I and II project for modernization and up gradation scheme of Jyoti Chitraban Film Society had been

completed by 2003 with Govt. of India funds amounting to Rs.8,79,50,000/- only, and the phase III project for Modernization and up gradation of Jyoti Chitraban Film Studio was completed by 2013 with Govt. of India funds amounting to Rs. 10.00 crores.

(3) Rs. 69.45 Crore has been granted as financial assistance to 359 Nos. of Satras of Assam.

(4) Rs. 10.00 crores have been incurred as expenditure for 14 Nos. of historical monuments so far for their protection, preservation and development.

(5) Archaeological Survey of India has taken up the protection, preservation and development of 5 monuments. These are (i) Singri Temple's ruins (ii) Urvarshi Archaeological Site (iii) Poa-Mecca, Hajo (iv) Kedar Temple, Hajo and (v) HayagrivaMadhava Temple, Hajo.

During the year 2020-21 an amount of Rs. 9.50 Lakh has been received for protection, Preservation and Development of Bauli Maidam Archaeological site, Sivasagar District under SOPD – G and during the year 2021-22, received an allocation of Rs.4.00 Crore, for Protection, Preservation and Development of 2 (Two) nos. of Archaeological sites (1) Bauli Maidam Archaeological Site, Sivasagar District and (2) Gargaon Capital ramparts Archaeological Site, Sivasagar District.

On the 46th Session of the World Heritage Committee of UNESCO held in New Delhi from 21st to 31st July 2024, Moidams-the Mound-Burial System of the Ahom Dynasty, Charaideo, Assam was declared as the 43rd World Heritage Property of India and 3rd World Heritage Property of Assam and 1st World Heritage Property of Northeast India in the cultural category.

(6) Executive Council of the Jawaharlal Nehru University has resolved to approve the establishment of an Assamese Chair in the Centre of Indian Language, Literature and Culture Studies of the University. The matter is being taken up with the Jawaharlal Nehru University.

(7) An Autonomous Institution namely Anandaram Borooah Institute of Language Art & Culture Assam (ABILAC) has been established on 12th December, 1989 with the Financial Assistance from Govt. of Assam. The Institute is pursuing Research for the development of Indigenous Language, Art and Culture of the State. Besides this, the Directorate of Higher Education provided annual grants to the following Voluntary Organizations for upliftment of the Language, Art and Culture in their respective field. The list of Voluntary Organizations involved are as follows:- (1) Indian Art History Congress, (2) Assam Sahitya Sabha, (3) Assam Science Society, (4) Institute of Adv. Study in Science & Technology, (5) Central Tai Academy, Patsaku, (6) Sadou Asom Lekhika Samaroah Samity, (7) Tai Sahitya Sabha, (8) Manipuri Sahitya Parishad, (9) Dimasa Sahitya Sabha,

(10) Karbi Lama T Amei (Karbi Sahitya Sabha), (11) Nepali Sahitya Parishad, (12) Rabha Academy, (13) Kamrup Sanskrit Sanjivani Sabha, (14) Kamrup Anusandhan Samity, (15) Purnakant Buragobhai Institute, (1) Institute of Tai Studies,

(8) The Government has already constituted BTR and six Autonomous Council namely- (i). Deori Autonomous Council, (ii). Tiwa Autonomous Council, (iii). Mising Autonomous Council, (iv). Rabha Hasong Autonomous Council, (v). Thengal Kachari Autonomous Council, and (vi). Sonowal Kachari Autonomous Council. State Government has also constituted thirty one nos. of Development Council, these are- (i). Moran, (ii) Mottok, (iii) Maimal, (iv) Moria, (v) Gorkha, (vi) Chutia, (vii) Adivasi, (viii) Nath Jogi, (ix) Koch Rajbongshi, (x) Bishnupriya Manipuri, (xi) Tai Ahom, (xii) Mech Kachari, (xiii) Manipuri, (xiv) Sadharan Jati, (xv) Singpho (Man Tai), (xvi) Amri Karbi, (xvii) Sarania Kachari, (xviii) Barak Valley Hill Tribes, (xix) Tea & Ex-Tea Garden, (xx) Scheduled Caste, (xxi) Chaodang, (xxii) Madahi, (xxiii) Kumar, (xxiv) Hajong, (xxv) Sut, (xxvi) Gorla, (xxvii) Barman Kachari, (xxviii) Development Council for Karbi people residing outside Karbi Anglong, (xxix) Hindi Speaking, (xxx) Bengali Speaking, and (xxxi) Jolha Development Council.

(9) Construction of Swahid Smarak Khetra & Park:- To commemorate the contribution of all those who sacrificed their lives during the Assam Agitation for the cause of their motherland, the government of Assam has decided to construct a Swahid Smarak Khetra (SSK) at Paschim Boragaon, Guwahati. The SSK will be an icon of the hopes and aspiration of the people of Assam and the sanctity of their culture and heritage, which have been cherished from time immemorial and to be protected for all times to come. The construction of the SSK being carried out by PW (Building & NH) Deptt. It will be an icon of the hopes and aspiration of the people of Assam and the sanctity of their culture and heritage. The first phase of the work is already completed and the Swahid Smarak Khetra & Park has been inaugurated by HCM on 10.12.2025. The entire campus will be maintained by GMDA as decided by the department in consultation with DoHUA.

(10) A Sub-Committee has been set up to examine and prepare a framework for implementation of all clauses of Assam Accord in general with special emphasis on Clause-6 (High Level Committee Report), Clause-7, Clause – 9 and Clause -10 along with updation of National Register of Citizens etc. 8 rounds of Sub-Committee meeting has already been held under the Chairmanship of Hon'ble Minister, Implementation of Assam Accord Department. The report of the sub-committee already submitted on 22nd November, 2025.

(11) Regarding Implementation status of Recommendations of Justice Biplap Sarma (Retd.) Committee on Clause 6 of Assam Accord :-
Government of Assam in its Cabinet meeting held on 04/09/2024 in North

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Lakhimpur has examined the report submitted by the Justice (Retired) Biplab Sharma High Level Committee, which was constituted by the Ministry of Home Affairs, Government of India, to implement Clause 6 of the Assam Accord. The Cabinet further decided to constitute a Group of Ministers, who will engage with the All-Assam Students' Union (AASU) and other organizations to develop a clear road map and implementation framework, with a goal of implementing all the Recommendations accepted by the Cabinet. Subsequently, a meeting was held on 25/09/2024 at Lok Sewa Bhawan under the Chairmanship of Hon'ble Chief Minister in presence of Group of Ministers, Chief Secretary, Assam, Senior Officers of stakeholder departments and members of AASU. In the meeting, it was decided that in the first phase, the 52 recommendations which fall within the exclusive purview of the State government as well as the Recommendations where a portion can be independently implemented by the Government of Assam shall be taken up for implementation through a time bound action plan by April 2025. In this regard, a draft action plan is prepared on the basis of action plans submitted by related depts. for onward submission in the next meeting with AASU under the chairmanship of HCM, Assam. A second round of discussions was held on 16/02/2025, chaired by the Hon'ble Chief Minister, with participation from the Group of Ministers, the Chief Secretary, senior officials of stakeholder departments, and representatives of AASU. In this meeting, it was resolved that in the first phase, 39 out of the 52 recommendations of the Justice B.K. Sharma Committee—those falling entirely within the jurisdiction of the State Government or partially implementable by it—would be prioritized for implementation within the calendar year 2025. Further, the third round of meeting was also held on 22/11/2025, chaired by the Hon'ble Chief Minister, with participation from the Group of Ministers, the Chief Secretary, senior officials of stakeholder departments, and representatives of AASU under 13 recommendations of Justice (Retired) Biplab Kumar Sharma High Level Committee.

Clause :

7. *The Government takes this opportunity to renew their commitment for the speedy all round economic development of Assam, so as to improve the standard of living of the people. Special emphasis will be placed on education and science & technology through establishment of national institutions.*

Action taken:

1. Implementation status of Bogibeel rail-cum-road mega project (Total 92.70 Km including 4.95 Km Bridge)-Bogibeel rail-cum-road bridge was inaugurated by Hon'ble Prime Minister of India on 25th December, 2018.

2. Numaligarh Refinery Limited was dedicated to the nation by the erstwhile Hon'ble Prime Minister Shri A. B. Vajpayee on 9th July, 1999. NRL has been able to display creditable performance since commencement of commercial production in October, 2000. With its concern, commitment and contribution to socio-economic development of the state combined with a track record of continuous growth, NRL has been conferred the status of Mini Ratna PSU.

3. The Shilghat Jute Mill has been reopened.

4. Assam Gas Cracker Project – (BCPL) at Lapatkata, Dibrugarh has been inaugurated by Hon'ble Prime Minister on 5th February, 2016.
5. Assam has witnessed significant improvement in industrial investment, with the upcoming Tata Semiconductor Assembly and Testing (TSAT) plant coming up in the erstwhile campus of HPCL at Jagiroad, Morigaon, with approximately Rs. 27,000 Cr investment. Beyond the magnitude of the investment, the potential development in modern technology sector and related upgradation in technical education and skill shall be critical for the future growth of Assam.
6. IIT has already been established in North Guwahati along with two Central Universities Namely Tezpur University, Tezpur and Assam University at Silchar. Besides these, for the development of Gauhati University and Dibrugarh University, necessary fund has also been provided. Moreover, State Govt. has established State Universities namely :- (1) K.K. Handique State Open University, (2) Bodoland University, (3) Cotton College State University, (4) Kumar Bhaskar Varma Sanskrit & Ancient Study University. For the Development of Higher Education Rs.198.82 Lakhs has already been provided for 6(Six) Nos. of State Universities for their infrastructural development during 2001-02 to 2015-2016. Moreover, Bhattadev University, Madhabdev University, Rabindranath Tagore University, Majuli University of Culture, Assam Women University, Assam Rajib Gandhi Cooperative Management University, Kanaklata University, Assam Skill University, Sri Sri Anirudhadeva Sports University etc have been established in Assam.
7. The Guwahati Medical College & Hospital has been upgraded to the level of Super-Specialty Hospital.
8. Various National Institutes as follows have been established in Assam:
 - a) Indian Institute of Information Technology, Guwahati.
 - b) National Law University and Judicial Academy, Guwahati
 - c) National Institute of Design, Jorhat
 - d) Institute of Hotel Management, Guwahati
 - e) All India Institute of Medical Sciences, Guwahati
 - f) Central Institute of Technology (CIT), Kokrajhar
 - g) Land has been allotted for establishment of National Forensic Science University near Changsari, Kamrup.

Other Issues:

Clause:

- 8.1 *The Government will arrange for the issue of citizenship certificates in future only by the authorities of the Central Government.*
- 8.2 *Specific complaints that may be made by the AASU/AAGSP about irregular issuance of Indian Citizenship Certificates (ICC) will be looked into.*

Action taken:

8.1 :- 2 nos. of proposals received from District Authority has been forwarded to Govt. of India for grant of Indian Citizenship

8.2 No complaint has been received regarding irregular issuance of Citizenship Certificate till date.

Clause:

9. *The international border shall be made secured against future infiltration by erection of physical barriers like walls, barbed wire fencing and other obstacles at appropriate places. Patrolling by security forces on land and riverine routes all along international border shall be adequately intensified. In order to further strengthen the security arrangements, to prevent effectively future infiltration, an adequate number of check posts shall be set up.*

9.2 *Besides the arrangements mentioned above and keeping in view security considerations, a road all along the international border shall be constructed so as to facilitate patrolling by security forces. Land between border and the road would be kept free of human habitation, wherever possible. Riverine patrolling along the international border would be intensified. All effective measures would be adopted to prevent infiltrators crossing or attempting to cross the international border.*

Action Taken: As per the information furnished by Border protection & Development Department that as per the instruction pertaining to strengthening international border security under Point No. 9 & 9.2 of the *Memorandum of Settlement*; Directorate of Border Protection & Development Department, Assam has implemented various infrastructure development projects within the radius of 0-10 km from the International Border.

However, there is no barbed wire fencing along the Indo-Bhutan International Border, whereas the Indo-Bangladesh International Border has been fenced. In this connection, this Directorate has collected the updated status of fencing along the Indo-Bangladesh International Border from the DIG, BSF, Guwahati Frontier and Mizoram & Cachar Frontier. The details are given below:

Unfenced border areas are secured through physical domination measures such as OP, special ambushes, vehicle and boat patrolling and OP towers for round-the-clock monitoring. Improvised river obstacles system has also been installed in river/ nallah gaps with concertina coil, barbed wire etc and technical surveillance systems like CCTV and PTZ cameras have also been installed. Riverine patrolling is conducted by the BSF using advanced systems like CIBMS and its Water Wing, while the Land Customs Station at Dhubri&Sribhumi regulates legal trade between India and Bangladesh through the Immigration Check Post (ICP).

Clause:

10. It will be ensured that relevant laws for prevention of encroachment of Government lands and lands in tribal belts and blocks are strictly enforced and unauthorized encroachers evicted as laid down under such laws.

Action taken:

Land administration in the Protected Belts and Blocks in Assam is administered as per provisions of Chapter X of the Assam land and Revenue Regulation 1886 and Rules framed there under. Steps had taken for removal of encroachment.

Clause:

11. It will be ensured that the relevant law restricting acquisition of immovable property by foreigners in Assam is strictly enforced.

Action taken:

The Assam Alienation of Land (Regulation) Act 1980 restricts the acquisition of immovable property by foreigners in Assam.

(The implementation of Clause 10 and 11 is a continuous process. Eviction is being carried out from time to time in Forest land, PGR, VGR and other Govt. land).

Clause:

12. It will be ensured that Birth and Death Registers are duly maintained.

Action taken:

Health & Family Welfare Department of the State has taken action.

Restoration of Normalcy:Clause:

13. The All Assam Students Union (AASU) and the All Assam Gana Sangram Parishad (AAGSP) call off the agitation, assure full co-operation and dedicate themselves towards the development of the country.

Action taken:

The All Assam Students Union (AASU) and the All Assam Gana Sangram Parishad (AAGSP) call off the agitation.

Clause:

14. The Central and the State Government have agreed to :-

- (a) review with sympathy and withdraw cases of disciplinary action taken against employees in the context of the agitation and to ensure that there is no victimization;*
- (b) frame a scheme for ex-gratia payment to next of kin of those who killed in the course of the agitation;*
- (c) give sympathetic consideration to proposal for relaxation of upper age limit for employment in public services in Assam, having regard to exceptional situation that prevailed in holding of academic and competitive examinations, etc. in the context of agitation in Assam;*

- (d) *undertake review of detention cases, if any, as well as cases against persons charged with criminal offences in connection with the agitation, except those charged with commission of heinous offences;*
- (e) *consider withdrawal of the prohibitory orders/ notifications in force, if any.*

Action taken:

Cases of disciplinary action taken against employees in the context of the agitation have been withdrawn and upper age limit for employment in public services in Assam has been relaxed.

An ex-gratia for an amount of Rs. 5,00,000/- each is given to the next of kin (NOK) of martyrs during Assam Agitation.

An ex-gratia amounting to Rs. 2,00,000/- each is given to the Bullet injured, Seriously Injured and Victimised Women of Assam Agitation/ their next of kin (NOK)s.

A Trust in the name and style of “The Assam Agitation Victims Welfare Trust” has been constituted for welfare of the victims of Assam Agitation and their family members.

Clause:

15. The Ministry of Home Affairs will be the nodal ministry for the implementation of the above.

CHAPTER-II**GRANT NO 11.****IMPLEMENTATION OF ASSAM ACCORD DEPARTMENT****OBSERVATIONS AND RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE COMMITTEE:**

1. The Committee observes that information of some martyrs plagues in the Swahid Smarak Kshetra are either incomplete or missing which attracts unwanted reactions from the visitors.

Therefore, the Committee recommends that the Department conduct a survey to identify incomplete or missing information relating to the martyrs commemorated at the Swahid Smarak Kshetra. The Committee further recommends that the Department verify the records and update the information wherever necessary.

2. The Committee observes that several sanctioned posts in the Department have remained vacant over a considerable period of time despite the increasing workload arising from the various projects and schemes. As a result, shortage of manpower in the Department has arisen.

Therefore, the Committee recommends filling up the existing vacant posts so as to strengthen the administrative set up.

3. The Committee observes that there is no separate Directorate of the Implementation of Assam Accord Department for which the Budget provision of the Department is very meager as the budget provision for Assam Accord Department under the Sub-Head-0326 for the Financial Year 2026-27 is only Rs.601.15 lakhs.

The Committee hence recommends that the Budget allocation to Implementation of Assam Accord Department may perhaps be enhanced.

With these observations, the Committee recommends that the total budget amount under Grant No. 11, Implementation of Assam Accord Department for the financial year 2026-27 be approved by the August House .

The Action taken on the recommendation made in the report may be submitted to the Committee within 90(ninety) days from the date of its presentation in the House.
