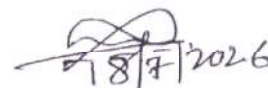
3. The Committee considered the Draft Report and approved it on **18th July, 2026**.

The Sports and Youth Welfare Department was created in the year 1987-88 with a view to promote the activities of sports & youth welfare in the State and since then, a good number of schemes have been successfully implemented under the aegis of this department.

Sports and Games are recognized by all as sound means for physical and mental development of a person. The energy of the youth if channelized properly can be pivotal in community and nation building. To make our generation strong, healthy and disciplined, various schemes for promotion of Sports and Games in the State have been envisaged.

1. PRELIMINARY STATUS PAPER RELATING TO GRANT NO.74

The Sports & Youth Welfare Department has received a budgetary allocation of Rs.8748.80 lakh under SOPD and Rs. 10213.52 under Establishment for the year 2025-26, totalling to Rs.18962.32 lakh for the implementation of various schemes of the department.

1. Assam bagged **3 Gold, 15 Silver and 16 Bronze medals** at the 38th National Games, Uttarakhand, 2025. The state was ranked 24 in the overall medals tally. The state government has decided to appoint 23 players, who won medals at the National Games and who are currently unemployed, in Class III posts, in various Departments in terms of the Integrated Sports Policy. It has also been decided to provide cash awards to 51 medal winners who are already employed with the government. 3 medal winners who are currently under age for appointment to Class- III posts in the State Govt. will be appointed to a government post on attaining the minimum age as required for employment.

4. Extending hospitality to the young players across the nation, Assam hosted the first All India U 23 Basketball Championship (Men and Women) which was organized by Assam Basketball Association in collaboration with Basketball Federation of India. The event was held from 18th to 24th March, 2025 at NCB Indoor Stadium, Sarusajai Sports Complex, Guwahati. The championship witnessed participation from 30 states in the Men's category and from 24 states in the Women's category.

5. Assam proudly hosted the Senior National Rugby 7's Championship for Men and Women which was organized by Indian Rugby Football Union, Rugby Association of Assam and the Dept. of Sports and Youth Welfare, from 23rd to 28th April, 2025.

6. The Department of Sports & Youth Welfare, in association with Jaideep Mukherjee Tennis Academy, has successfully organized advanced Lawn Tennis training camp at Dispur Lawn Tennis Court, from 21st to 27th July, 2025. The camp was conducted by Somdev Barman, International Tennis player.

7. The Department of Sports & Youth Welfare in association with Abhinav Futuristics Pvt. Ltd. has successfully organized workshop on Sports Science at Sarusajai Sports Complex, Guwahati, from 25th to 30th June, 2025.

8. With a view to causing a scientific study of sports performances, the Government of Assam inaugurated the third High Performance Sports Training and Rehabilitation Centre, in association with the Abhinav Bindra Foundation, at Kokrajhar on 15th July, 2025. The centre was inaugurated by the Hon'ble Chief Minister, Assam. This centre will complement and strengthen the ecosystem created by the centres already present in Jorhat and Guwahati, by acting as a regional hub for elite sports development in the state.

9. The Department of Sports & Youth Welfare in association with JICA & NCDA, has successfully organized workshop on JICA-India Women's Leadership & Coaching Empowerment Program at Sarusajai Sports Complex, Guwahati, from 23rd to 30th July, 2025.

10. The Department of Sports & Youth Welfare has successfully completed the Coaching Camp of Khel Maharan 2.0 in the discipline of Athletics, Football, Kabaddi, Swimming and Volleyball from 1st to 30th of July, 2025, at Sarusajai Sports Complex.

11. Khel Maharan 2.0 saw the selection of 554 talented players, who received training from experienced coaches including Anupama Srivastava as Athletics Head Coach, M H Kumara (FIVB Level 3 Coach, Former India Team Coach) as Volleyball Head Coach, Shyam Manik Lodh (AFC 'A' Diploma holder, Ex. Chief Football Coach at Sports Authority of India, Master's in Sports Coaching) as Football Head Coach, Fariha Zaman as Swimming Head Coach, and Ramesh Nuggappa Bhendigiri as Kabaddi Head Coach. The success stories from this edition include:

- a. Jubin Gohain, Meghali Buragohain, and Rajarshi Barman have been selected to join the prestigious JSW Inspire Institute of Sports (IIS) Academy in Bengaluru. Other shortlisted candidates from Khel Maharan 2.0 coaching camp were Mohan Baro, Dhritima Deka, Dhritima Ujir, Abhilasha Dutta, and Arpan Tai.
- b. Darshita Baruah, Abhigyan Mohan, and Prayash Gogoi were selected for induction into the High-Performance Swimming Centre, Odisha.
- c. Nibir Nilim Krow, Gyandeep Borgohain, Ahlad Aditya, Bhumika Kashyap, Tonmoy Bharali, and Angarika Saikia have been selected for one month selection trial to be conducted by Inspire Institute of Sport, Vijayanagara.
- d. Paul Baruah, Dhwiimu Boro, Bidhon Basumatary, Ritupan Boro, and Ratiram Basumatary have been selected from Khel Maharan 2.0 coaching camp to represent Assam in the U-15 National Football Championship, 2025.
- e. Sarashreya Talukdar (Under-17 category) achieved remarkable improvements in multiple swimming events, winning CBSE gold medal in 50m breaststroke and selected for CBSE nationals, along with CBSE silver medals in 50m butterfly, 100m butterfly, 200m individual medley, and 50m backstroke, earning selection for nationals in all events.
- f. Mahsood Khalid Borah (Under-17 category) participated in the CBSE Clusters (Far East Zone) and won a gold medal in the 800m freestyle.
- g. Aryaputra Chetia participated in the CBSE Far East Zone competitions and showcased remarkable improvement.

12. Rehabilitation of Injured Players: The Department of Sports & Youth Welfare, Assam under the aegis of Sport for Life Campaign, launched by the Abhinav Bindra Foundation Trust (ABFT), is supporting athletes in Assam who suffer from career-threatening injuries. By partnering with leading medical professionals and Centres of Excellence (COEs), ABFT ensures timely surgical

intervention, rehabilitation, and a guided return to sport. The key highlights are as follows:

- a.** 5 successful surgeries completed for athletes from Football, Boxing, and Kick Boxing.
- b.** Support from leading orthopedic surgeons like Dr. Mahibul Islam (Assam) and Dr. Manit Arora (Chandigarh).
- c.** 100% recovery rate: All athletes are either under rehabilitation or have resumed training.
- d.** Strong coordination between athletes, doctors, and ABFT teams across India.

Inspiring Recovery Stories:

- a.** Hina Limboo (Kick Boxing): Treated for a discoid meniscus injury in August 2023.
 - b.** Alen Deory (Football): Underwent ACL & meniscus surgery in September 2023.
 - c.** Yongsen AO (Football): Recovered from an ACL & lateral meniscus tear in December 2023.
 - d.** Tridip Kalita (Boxing): ACLR surgery in January 2025, now six months into rehab.
 - e.** Aikon Mili (Boxing): Shoulder surgery in June 2025; currently in physiotherapy and rehab.
- 13.** Ababil Ali made history by being the first para-athlete of Assam to win the silver medal in 100 meters, T-44 Men category at the World Para Athletics Grand Prix held at New Delhi in March, 2025.
- 14.** A weeklong Master Trainers' Training Programme on Elderly Care, Safety and Security of Women, Disaster Management, and First Aid was organized by the Department of Sports & Youth Welfare, Government of Assam (NSS Section) from 13th to 21st March, 2025. The training saw the participation of 117 NSS Volunteers and 19 Programme Officers representing 19 colleges.
- 15.** Out of the 30 participants selected from Assam for the National Level of the Viksit Bharat Young Leaders Dialogue (VBYLD) 2025, 7 (seven) nos. of participants were from the National Service Scheme (NSS).

16. Residential High-Performance Coaching Camp and Talent Identification Programme, 2025–26: Going forward, the Department of Sports & Youth Welfare, Assam conducted a Residential High-Performance Coaching Camp and Talent Identification Programme as part of its structured athlete and coach development initiative from 16th January to 27th January, 2026 at Guwahati. The programme aims to strengthen the high-performance ecosystem through focused coach orientation, systematic talent identification, and advanced athlete preparation across priority sports disciplines. The camps were implemented at recognized sports infrastructure within Assam and selected national centers, ensuring exposure to best practices, modern training methodologies, and scientific athlete monitoring.

The coaching camps was conducted under the supervision of foreign coaches and renowned Indian coaches in the disciplines of Table Tennis, Lawn Tennis, Swimming, and Chess, while the Inspire Institute of Sports will oversee training in Athletics, Archery, and Taekwondo.

- To conduct high-performance residential coaching camps for identified athletes.
- To implement talent identification programmes with scientific assessment tools.
- To orient and up skill coaches through phase-wise orientation programmes.
- To prepare athletes for state, national, and international competitions.
- To create a performance database for long-term athlete development.

17. Action taken Report on the Recommendations of Twenty Second Report of the Departmentally Related Standing Committee on Development (F) Department, Assam Legislative Assembly on Grant No. 74: Sports and Youth Welfare

Sl No.	Recommendation	Action Taken Report
1.	The Committee took note of the report of the Sports and Youth Welfare Department that sports infrastructure projects are no longer through it but by the PWD (B). Therefore, the Committee recommends it will convene a meeting of officials of the Department of Sports and Youth Welfare and the PWD Buildings jointly after the budget session is over to discuss the status of the sports projects.	As per the direction of the Hon'ble Chief Minister, Assam, all capital projects of the Sports & Youth Welfare Department were transferred to the Assam Public Works (Building) Department during the Financial Year 2022-23. A review meeting was held under the chairmanship of the Hon'ble Minister, Sports & Youth Welfare, Assam, on 25th March, 2025 to discuss various issues relating to the progress and completion of ongoing sports infrastructure projects being implemented by the Assam Public Works (Building) Department. Subsequently, a meeting to review the Action Taken Report on the decisions of the previous meeting was convened on 26th May, 2025. The list of completed projects is enclosed herewith at Annexure-C.
2.	The Committee observes that the sports infrastructures are not well maintained in many districts. The Committee recommended that the Department should try and develop a mechanism for the maintenance of newly created sports infrastructure or already existing infrastructure through PPP, if possible, on a revenue-sharing model that will generate resources for the Department.	The Government has issued notifications vide No. SYW.277.2022/29 dated 03-02-2023 and No. SYW.277.2022/28 dated 03-02-2023 for taking over possession of completed projects, with projects costing up to Rs. 25.00 crore being handed over to the Board of Sports and those costing above Rs. 25.00 crore being handed over to the Sports Authority of Assam. The Department has entrusted the District Sports Officers with the responsibility of acting as Estate Officers for the sports infrastructure under their respective jurisdictions. The Department is further exploring the engagement of various stakeholders for the maintenance and management of newly created as well as existing sports infrastructure through the Public-Private Partnership (PPP) mode.

3.	The Committee also observed that the Department of Tea Tribes and Adivasi Welfare is constructing various sports infrastructure across the State. As such, the Committee recommended that the Tea Tribes and Adivasi Welfare (TTAW) Department should consult the Sports and Youth Welfare Department regarding the technical aspects of construction before going ahead with implementing of such sports projects.	A letter was received from the Director, Tea Tribes and Adivasi Welfare, Assam, Rupnagar, Guwahati-32, requesting this Directorate to take over the following Sports Academies established under their Department and to submit a detailed proposal along with a budget estimate for their operationalization: (i) Archery Academy for Girls, Sonari, Charaideo; (ii) Football Academy for Boys, Chotatingrai, Tinsukia (iii) Football Academy for Boys, Rangapara, Sonitpur. Accordingly, this Directorate issued a communication vide Letter No. DSYW/796160/6 dated 10-06-2026 to the Director, Tea Tribes and Adivasi Welfare, Assam, requesting detailed information regarding the infrastructure created at the above-mentioned academies, along with recent photographs of the existing facilities, to facilitate the preparation of the detailed proposal and budget estimate.
4.	The Committee also observed that there is currently no policy or budget to support Veteran Sports Associations for organizing sports events. The Department however does try to provide limited support on a case-to-case basis upon receipt of petitions. The Committee recommends that the Department should examine the possibility of supporting such Veteran Sports Associations regularly in the future by budgeting for it.	The Department has taken note of the recommendation of the Committee. At present, the Department's primary focus is on identification, nurturing, and development of grassroots-level players and athletes with the objective of enabling them to excel and represent the State and the Country in national and international sporting events such as the Commonwealth Games, Asian Games and the Olympic Games. Accordingly, the resources are being prioritized towards talent identification, coaching, training and infrastructure development for emerging athletes. The Department will examine the feasibility of formulating an appropriate policy and providing budgetary support to such Associations in the future.

5.	The Committee observed that sports equipment is being provided to one Youth Club in every Legislative Assembly Constituency as per the announcement in the Budget Speech, and that Rs. 15.00 lakh being provided partly in cash and partly in kind like sports and gym equipment to each such Youth Club. The Committee recommends the Department to provide the list of Youth Clubs approved and a copy of the SOP prepared. The Committee also recommended that the Department should consider positively any requests received from MLAs for providing basic sports equipment.	The Youth Clubs identified in each Legislative Assembly Constituency (LAC), which have been provided with Sports and Gym equipment, are intended to serve as repositories of sports equipment for their respective constituencies. These Youth Clubs are expected to cater to the sports equipment requirements of athletes, youth and sports enthusiasts across the entire LAC. At present, there is no proposal under consideration for the separate distribution of additional sports goods or equipment. However, the sports equipment procured under Khel Maharan 1.0 and Khel Maharan 2.0 are available with the respective District Sports Officers and may be utilized by local youth and athletes for regular training and practice purposes. The list of Youth Clubs approved and a copy of the SOP are enclosed at Annexure D and E.
6.	The Committee reiterated that a plan of action be prepared for facilitating sports activities when the Nehru Stadium is dismantled and when construction work is in progress so that there is no impediment in the promotion of sports in the City during that period. Therefore, the Committee recommends that alternate Sports complex/Stadiums may be arranged to boost the practice of the sports activities.	The Department of Sports & Youth Welfare has made the following arrangements to ensure the continuity of sports activities during the redevelopment of the R.G. Baruah Sports Complex. All sports disciplines under the Sports Department that were being conducted at the R.G. Baruah Sports Complex have been shifted to alternative venues for the smooth continuation of regular coaching programmes. The details are as follows: 1. Swimming – Dr. Zakir Hussain Aquatic Complex. 2. Yoga – BhogeswariPhukanani Indoor Stadium, Dispur 3. Gymnasium – BhogeswariPhukanani Indoor Stadium, Dispur.

		4. Basketball – Public Health Engineering Basketball Ground, Hengrabari Campus. 5. Tennis – Tennis Complex, Dispur. 6. Table Tennis – BhogeswariPhukanani Indoor Stadium, Dispur. 7. Badminton – Three maple wood flooring courts, along with hover mats and poles, have been installed at Cotton University. An MoU between the Sports Authority of Assam and Cotton University has already been executed, and coaching activities will commence shortly. Further, the sports disciplines being operated by various Sports Associations at the R.G. Baruah Sports Complex have also been relocated by the respective Associations to suitable alternative venues for the continuation of their activities. Therefore, all necessary measures have been taken to ensure that the redevelopment of the R.G. Baruah Sports Complex does not impede the promotion and development of sports in Guwahati during the construction period.
7.	The Committee observed that without good coaches it will be difficult for Assam to become a sports powerhouse. The Committee recommends that at least 20 coaches in selected Olympic sports disciplines should be appointed, on contractual basis if necessary, by the Sports and Youth Welfare during this financial year.	The approval for filling up the sanctioned vacant posts of Permanent Coaches and Contractual Coaches has been received from the Finance Department. The Department has initiated the process for filling these posts and the recruitment process will commence shortly.

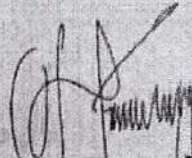

No. SYW.502183/16: In pursuance of Cabinet decision held on 19/06/2024, the Governor of Assam is pleased to issue the following guidelines for implementation of scheme for providing financial assistance of Rs. 15.00 lakh to one Youth Club in each of the 126 Legislative Assembly Constituencies (LACs) across Assam :

**GUIDELINES FOR IMPLEMENTATION OF SCHEME OF YOUTH CLUB
IN EACH LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY CONSTITUENCY**

• **Introduction:**

A new scheme for providing financial assistance of Rs. 15.00 lakh to one Youth Club in each of the 126 Legislative Assembly Constituencies (LACs) across Assam was announced in the budget speech for the financial year 2024-25.

The Hon'ble Cabinet deliberated on the scheme at its meeting held on 19th June, 2024 and issued directions that suitable Guidelines are to be prepared for its implementation.

Guidelines were discussed during the Conference of District Commissioners on 29th July, 2024 and were approved.

• **Key Features:**

- One Youth Club will be identified within each LAC for receipt of support, partly financial and partly in kind, from the State Government, under the aforesaid scheme.
- Sports Associations / Small Khelo India Centres will be considered as being at par with Youth Clubs for consideration of support under this scheme, if otherwise eligible and selected by the Committee to be constituted for this purpose.
- The Youth Clubs will serve as the largest repository of sports equipment at the LAC level besides being the fulcrum of the promotion and development of sports at the grassroots level, talent identification through events like the Khel Maharan and involve all stakeholders like the Sports Associations, Employees of the Sports and Youth Welfare Department, Physical Instructors and Coaches and veteran sportspersons.
- For the purpose of this scheme, LAC will mean the LAC as per the latest delimitation of constituencies.
- A first instalment of INR 5 lakhs will be provided to each selected Youth Club through the District Commissioner.
- This first instalment will be a flexi-pool of resources to be utilized by the Youth Club for infrastructure development purposes, including uplifting / repairing of the premises. Such improvement could include improving the floor for setting up multi-gyms, installation of AC, ceiling fans etc. Decision regarding how the funds are to be utilized will be determined after assessment at the local level and with the approval of the District Commissioner.
- The balance of the committed amount i.e. INR 10 lakhs shall be earmarked by the Sports and Youth Welfare Department towards the cost of equipments which shall be centrally procured by the Department through GeM Portal after due consultation with the individual beneficiary club for

the procurement and supply of sports equipment to each selected Youth Club. The equipment selected should be useful and relevant as part of Khel Maharan in the future.

- Selection of the LAC level Youth Club within a district will be done by the District Commissioner strictly based on past performance and potential future performance in consultation with Local MLA of new delimited LACs / Guardian Minister of the district.
- **General Eligibility Conditions for Consideration for Selection as a notified Youth Club**
- Operational Youth Clubs having access to infrastructure (either own or rented or under some kind of agreement) will be considered for provision of support.
- The Youth Club must preferably be registered under Societies Registration Act 1860. This requirement may be waived by the District Commissioner if the Youth Club is well known and has done good work in the district.
- The Club must have a Bank Account in its name (as registered under Societies Registration Act). Up to date Bank Statement must be produced before the selection committee when sought.
- The Club must furnish to the appropriate authority reports on sports or relevant activity undertaken by it during the last 2 (two) years if and when sought.
- A self-declaration by the intending Youth Club is to be submitted with regards to the receipt of Government fund during previous years, if any.
- The Club must submit an annual plan of sports activities /coaching and training in Olympic recognized sports disciplines along with Athletics as compulsory event immediately upon selection.
- These conditions are illustrative and suggestive and not exhaustive.
- **Utilization of fund by the Youth Club:**
 - i. The Youth Club shall utilize the funds received from the District Commissioner solely for the purpose for which the fund has been sanctioned.
 - ii. The Youth Club shall maintain financial transparency and refrain from taking any steps that hinder the financial stability of the Youth Club.
 - iii. The Youth Club must ensure that there is no misuse of funds provided to it. In case of proven charges of delinquency or financial impropriety or irregularity or illegality through an enquiry, suitable administrative and legal action will be initiated against the Youth Club. Such a Youth Club shall be blacklisted and shall not be eligible for receipt of any funding / other support from the state government in the future.
- **Recording and Reporting:**
 - i. The Youth Club shall keep detailed records of all expenditure relating to the Youth Club.
 - ii. The Youth Club shall maintain the records like stock register and provide access to such records to concerned authorities.
 - iii. The Youth Club shall produce all records and reports to the Directorate of Sports & Youth Welfare, Assam as and when required.
 - iv. The Youth Club shall keep record of their sportspersons manually or digitally.
- **Organizing Sports Competition and Participation:**
 - i. The Youth Club shall assist the District Commissioner in conducting Khel Maharan as and when held.
 - ii. The Youth Club shall provide all necessary sports equipment and logistic support during Khel Maharan and training to the registered players without charging user fees.
 - iii. The Youth Club shall not allow non-sporting activities within the premises (Playfield/Office/Campus).
- **Talent Identification:**
 - i. The Youth Club shall give special emphasis on identification of promising talents in line with the endeavour to "Catch Them Young".
 - ii. The Youth Club shall keep a detailed record (Personal, Anthropometric measurement, etc.) of the sportspersons who are exceptionally talented and promising.

- iii. The Youth Club shall encourage sportspersons to participate in trials and other talent hunt programme organized by the Department, sports organization or sports association or any other sports body.
- iv. The Youth Club shall invite sports association or sports organization or any other sports body to conduct trials and talent hunt camps in their Youth club.
- v. The talent identified should preferably be in sports disciplines recognized by the International Olympic Committee or Indian Olympic Association.
- **Maintenance of Sports Equipment and Gym:**
 - i. The Youth Club shall be responsible for any damage or loss of sports equipment or gym.
 - ii. The Youth Club shall keep all the sports equipment in a systematic manner and maintain a sports equipment inventory.
- **Review and Monitoring of activities:**
 - i. A District Level Monitoring Committee (DLMC) shall be formed with the following to monitor the activities of the Youth Club as per Annexure - I
 - ii. The DLMC shall review activities of the Youth Club regularly and at least once every two months.
 - iii. The Youth Club may obtain technical support from the District Sports Officer and/ or District Sports Association as per their requirement. Two Physical Instructors shall be attached to each Youth Club by the DLMC.
 - iv. Reviewing of the activities should be purposive, positive, progressive, encouraging and goal oriented.
 - v. The Directorate of Sports & Youth Welfare, Assam shall cause inspection of the activities of the Youth Club at least once a year, preferably in the month of April of each year for the preceding FY.

The above guidelines shall come into force with immediate effect.

CHAPTER-II

OBSERVATIONS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

GRANT NO-74

1. The Committee observed that the Youth Clubs in every district have almost become inactive and lack adequate youth club infrastructures. Special mention in this regard is the Arimatta Stadium in Rangia District.

Therefore, the Committee recommends to strengthen and encourage sports youth clubs, as well as stadiums constructed on government land and with government funding, across Assam. The Committee also recommends to complete all the incomplete stadiums with all amenities like guard wall, flood light, etc.

2. During the course of discussion, the Committee observed that some of the newly formed constituencies after delimitation are lacking even a single sports club.

The Committee recommends that, it is to be ensured by the department to grant sports youth clubs along with sports materials like football, badminton, etc. in all the constituencies where there is a short fall of the same as per prescribed scale.

3. The Committee observes that sporting events in Assam have promoted and encouraged the youths at grassroot level to a great extent

Hence, the Committee recommends to organize competitions in Olympic disciplines, as done in previous years by organizing Khel Maharan, as well as other equivalent sports events on inter-district and inter-state levels.

4. The Committee observed that the Nehru Stadium is a major sports venue for the sportspersons in and around Guwahati. Shifting Nehru Stadium from the city may affect accessibility and travel to sports lovers.

The Committee recommends that, while redeveloping Nehru Stadium into an international standard football stadium, continued coaching activities in other disciplines must be maintained without interruption.

5. The Committee observes that in recent times, Squash has gained much popularity along with other disciplinary sports.

The Committee recommends to promote Squash across districts in Assam, facilitating with multi-purpose, well-equipped indoor stadiums. Additionally, suitable arrangements should be made in regard to indoor sports, facilities for sports like gymnastics, swimming, boxing, etc.

With these observations, the Committee recommends that the total budget amount under Grant No. 74 Sports & Youth Welfare Department for the financial year 2026-27 be approved by the August House .

The Action Taken Report on the recommendations made in the report may be submitted to the Committee within 90 (ninety) days from the date of its presentation to the House.
