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CHAPTER-I
REPORT

POINT NO. 1: PRELIMINARY STATUS PAPER RELATING TO
GRANT NO 38 (NOW 83), TEA TRIBES & ADIVASI WELFARE DEPARTMENT

The Grant No. 38 of the Assam Budget relates to the Tea Tribes & Adivasi Welfare Department and Department of Tribal Affairs (Plain). However during the financial year 2025-26, the Finance (Budget) Department vide Notification No.BB.13/2022/42, dated 22-02-2025 issued a new Grant No. 83 to the Tea Tribes & Adivasi Welfare Department. Tea Tribes & Adivasi Welfare Department is the Administrative Department to control the Budget allocated for *Directorate of Tea Tribes & Adivasi Welfare, Assam*.

To achieve socio-economic development of the Tea Tribes and Adivasi community, the Govt. of Assam created a separate Directorate, viz. - Directorate for Welfare of Tea & Ex-Tea Garden Tribes, Assam under the administrative control of WPT & BC Department, in 1983-1984. In the year 2004, Govt. of Assam created a separate Department namely "Tea Tribes Welfare Department" as Administrative Department for all-round socio-economic development of the community and proper co-ordination with other line Departments in the implementation of welfare schemes.

Recently, Govt. of Assam has notified a change in the name of the Department from the "Tea Tribes Welfare Department" to "Tea Tribes and Adivasi Welfare Department" vide Notification No. AR.08/2023/10, dated 13-04-2023. Accordingly, the name of the Directorate has also been changed from "Directorate of Tea Tribes Welfare, Assam" to "Directorate of Tea Tribes and Adivasi Welfare, Assam".

The Budget provision and expenditure for the financial years 2023-24, 2024-25, 2025-26 and also the Budget proposed for the financial year 2026-27 under the control of the Tea Tribes & Adivasi Welfare Department is given below:

Sir, In inviting a reference to the subject above, I am directed to inform you that in view of evolving land-use priorities and the need to ensure optimal utilization of surplus land in all tea estates other than that of small tea growers, it was found expedient to review the Assam Fixation of Ceiling on Land Holdings Act, 1956 (Assam Act I of 1957) and to amend the relevant provisions under the Act to exclude "labour lines (garden labour colonies)" from the definition of ancillary purpose.. Accordingly, the Assam Fixation of Ceiling of Land Holdings (Amendment) Act, 2025 has been enacted by the Assam Legislative Assembly and has received the assent of the Hon'ble Governor of Assam on 9th December, 2025. The said Act has been published in the Assam Gazette vide Notification No.LGL.56/2025/4 dated 10th December, 2025. Further, The Assam Fixation of Ceiling on Land Holdings Rules, 1957 has also been approved by the Hon'ble Cabinet in its meeting held on 18-12-2025 and published in the Gazette Notification on 23-12-2025 to insert new Rules 18-A and 18-B to prescribe the manner for initiation of acquisition proceedings under the newly inserted Section 7-A and for settlement of acquired lands under Section 17-A of the The Assam Fixation of Ceiling on Land Holdings (Amendment) Act , 2025. The Amendment Act has, inter alia, amended Section 3(q) of the principal Act by enlarging the definition of "Tea Garden Worker" to include permanent and temporary workers as well as descendants of tea garden workers residing within the labour line area of a tea estate on the date of commencement of the Act, belonging to Tea Tribes and Adivasi communities as notified by the Government from time to time The newly inserted Section 17A provides for settlement of land acquired under Section 7A with Tea Garden Workers residing in the labour lines.

The Act further provides that such settled land shall be heritable and shall not be transferable by way of sale, lease, gift or otherwise for a period of twenty years or such period as may be notified by the Government from time to time.

After expiry of the said period, such land may be transferred only in favour of another Tea Garden Worker residing in the same tea estate. It is submitted that the Amendment seeks to secure land rights of Tea Garden Workers residing in labour lines and integrate provision of housing and other social welfare measures under the Central Government as well as State Government schemes. The amended Act ensures that by excluding such lands from the scope of ancillary purposes will enable the Government to identify and resume surplus land for developmental and redistributive use, ensure greater transparency and consistency in land records management, and facilitate the integration of tea garden labour housing into mainstream government housing, social welfare, and public health programmes. Further, it is to inform that the Government of Assam, under the provisions of the amended Act, has already started the process of patta distribution to the eligible Tea garden workers residing in the Tea gardens. The allotment of labour line pattas to tea garden workers is being done in a phased manner. In the first phase, 106 tea gardens have been covered, under which 28,831 pattas have been distributed. In the second phase, 250 tea gardens, covering approximately 1,14,000 tea garden households, have been taken up. At present, the survey process in these tea gardens is under progress.

Chapter II**OBSERVATIONS RECOMMENDATIONS
ON TEA TRIBES AND ADIVASI WELFARE DEPARTMENT
GRANT NO. 83**

1. The Committee observes that, the tea garden labourers in the course of their work in the tea gardens become exhausted due to the heat. The need to have leisure break, may be for lunch, baby feeding etc. demands for waiting shed at a marginal distance in the tea garden areas.

The Committee recommends to construct waiting sheds in every tea garden and in every constituency wherever it is required.

2. The Committee reiterates the recommendation under point no. 2 of the 2nd Report of DRSC (F) for the year 2025-26 and observed that more patient Guest House may be constructed.

The Committee thus recommends to expedite the construction of patient and attendant Guest House at Guwahati. Further, the Committee recommends construction of another patient and attendant Guest House for Tea Tribes & Adivasi community at Dibrugarh, similar to the Guest House at Guwahati.

3. The Committee reiterates the recommendation under point no. 3 of the 2nd Report of DRSC (F) for the year 2025-26 and observed that out of a total of 46 boys and girls hostels, only 26 are functioning. The rest of the hostels are in an incomplete stage. The Committee observe that, the DRSC (F) Committee had recommended to complete the work within a span of six month in 2025-26. However, the Committee observed that the work remains unfinished even in 2026-27.

As such, the Committee recommends to complete the repairing and rennovation of Tea Tribes Girls Hostel at ITI, Tezpur complex and Tea Tribes Boys Hostel at Tezpur within the stipulated time and, at places where the buildings have totally worn out, those structures may be dismantled and proposal for new construction should be initiated at the earliest.

4. The Committee observes that, the tea garden areas lack in proper drinking water facilities, sanitation facilities and nominal medical facility etc.

The Committee, therefore, recommends that the department should take initiative in providing the basic facilities like drinking water, sanitation and medical facilities, etc. in those constituency where there it the need for the same. A special mention in this regard is the Mornoi Tea Estate.

With these observations, the Committee recommends that the total budget amount under Grant No.83, Tea Tribes and Adivasi Welfare Department for the financial year 2026-27 be approved by the August House.

The Action Taken on the recommendation made in the report may be submitted to the Committee within 90 (ninety) days from the date of its presentation in the House.
