Based on the recommendations of the Committee, the Department has initiated the development of a preliminary marketplace module on the Asom Udyog Setu website (State Level MSME Portal) and Application under the Central Sector Scheme “Raising and Accelerating MSME Performance (RAMP)” of the Ministry of MSME, Government of India. The module aims to create a dedicated digital platform for the promotion, visibility and marketing of products manufactured and produced by local entrepreneurs and MSMEs across the State. The module includes static information of entrepreneurs, including details such as enterprise name, contact information, address, and product descriptions, photographic representations of their products and links to websites where the product is available. The portal also includes a district-wise and sector-wise profiling of key products, including those identified under the One District One Product (ODOP) initiative, thereby highlighting the unique strengths and specialties of different districts of Assam. In addition to that initiatives are been taken for on-boarding of local entrepreneurs on e market places.
2	The Committee recommends with a request to R&DM Department to allocate available land to the Industries, Commerce & Public Enterprises (IC&PE) Department for establishing and creation of industrial hubs in each and every Assembly Constituency.	As per the suggestion of the DRSC, Revenue & DM Department along with District Commissioners of various districts have been requested by the Industrial Corporations (AIDC Ltd., AIIDC, ASIDC Ltd.) under Industries, Commerce and PE department for allotment of land considering the feasibility of establishment of Industrial Estates at different locations across the State.
3	The Committee has observed that ITI	As per information received from the

	center in Kohora (Kaziranga) is in non-functional condition. Therefore, the Committee recommends to closely work with Skill, Employment & Entrepreneurship Department (SEED) to set up at least one ITI Centre in each and every Assembly Constituency across the State. Further, as requested by the Hon'ble MLA, Sivasagar LAC, one no. of ITI may be established in Sivasagar LAC.	Department of Skill, Employment and Entrepreneurship (SEED), ITI Kohora is currently being developed under the Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) initiative of Numaligarh Refinery Limited (NRL) with the following objectives: (a) To introduce new job roles and transform ITI Kohora into a State-of-the-Art Tourism and Hospitality Training Institute. (b) To establish a Centre of Excellence aimed at benefiting local communities and the State of Assam by promoting sustainable employment and livelihood opportunities in the vicinity of the World Heritage Site. Further, Government buildings in 54 Assembly Constituencies have been identified and found suitable for the establishment of Industrial Training Institutes (ITIs), as per the prescribed norms, including Hahchara Junior College in the Sivasagar Legislative Assembly Constituency (LAC).
4	The Committee reiterates its earlier recommendation to set up Food Packaging and Processing Industry/Common Facility Center (CFC) in each Assembly Constituency across the state. IC & PE Department to co-ordinate with Revenue & Disaster Management (R&DM) Department to take every possible step to allocate land for the above purpose.	The PM Formalisation of Micro Food Processing Enterprises (PMFME) Scheme provides for the establishment of Common Facility Centres (CFCs) with a maximum project cost of Rs.10.00 crore. The scheme offers financial assistance in the form of a 35% credit-linked subsidy, subject to a maximum subsidy ceiling of Rs.3.00 crore per project. The Scheme is to facilitate the mobilization of Farmer Producer Organizations (FPOs), Cooperative Societies, Self-Help Groups (SHGs) and Federations for the preparation and submission of viable CFC proposals. At present, four fresh CFC subsidy proposals, involving a total subsidy amount of ₹182.30 lakh, are under various stages of processing, including bank appraisal and project appraisal, in the districts of Kamrup (Rural), Dhemaji, Tinsukia and Sonitpur. These projects are proposed to be implemented on private land or on land owned by the respective societies.

5	The Committee recommends that the Department should develop one Standard Operating methodology like single window or portal by mentioning the detailed process for registration of new entrepreneur to make the registration process transparent.	It may be noted that UDYAM Registration can be done by the entrepreneur himself/herself on self declaration basis through the UDYAM Registration portal, free of cost. As per recommendation of the Committee, the Department has developed a single page SOP for registration under Ease of Doing Business and Udyam Registration Portals. The SOPs have been widely circulated across all districts through the District Industries and Commerce Centres among the general public, existing industrial units and relevant associations to create greater awareness and facilitate smoother access to the EODB and UDYAM registration processes. A series of videos have also been uploaded in Youtube to guide entrepreneurs in availing various services offered under the EODB portal. Again, under RAMP programme, UDYAM registration drives are being conducted in each district to facilitate UDYAM registration of the MSMEs.
6	The Committee observes that there is minimal involvement of local Self Help Group (SHG). Further, the Committee recommends for involvement of local Self Help Group (SHG) for establishment of food processing units in each and every Assembly Constituency.	Financial assistance has been extended to members of Self-Help Groups (SHGs) under the Seed Capital Component and the Credit-Linked Component of the Prime Minister Formalisation of Micro Food Processing Enterprises (PMFME) Scheme. Under the Seed Capital Component, an amount of Rs.114.84 crore has been released to 37,408 SHG members, till date. Further, under the Credit-Linked Component, banks have sanctioned loans to 4,533 SHG members for the establishment of various food processing manufacturing units, involving a total loan amount of Rs.61.89 crore. Out of these, 4,003 nos. of loans, amounting to Rs.51.20 crore, have already been disbursed by the banks.

General Manager, District Industries and Commerce Centre (DICC), Kamrup, was instructed to inspect the industrial units located in the Greater Palashbari Area to assess their waste disposal practices. Accordingly, officials of DICC, Kamrup have so far inspected 25 industrial units and found that all the units have appropriate waste management systems in place. Further, the Member Secretary, Assam Pollution Control Board, has been requested to furnish a detailed report on the waste disposal systems adopted by the industrial units in the Greater Palashbari Area.
8	The Committee recommends spot visits/tour programs to various industrial hubs.

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OBSERVATIONS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

INDUSTRIES, COMMERCE & PUBLIC ENTERPRISES DEPARTMENT

GRANT NO- 58 & 60

After presentation of the Budget in the House for the Financial Year 2026-27 and after having a threadbare discussion on Preliminary status paper, Action Taken Report, the Committee made the following Observations and Recommendations.

1. The Committee recommends that proper mapping should be initiated for the “*One District One Product*” to highlight the unique strength and specialities of different districts of Assam.
2. The Committee recommends that to encourage the local entrepreneurs, the Department should take initiative in creating awareness among villagers through workshop or social media for introducing the policies carried out by the Industries Department.
3. The Committee recommends that the Department should connect the entrepreneurs to *Mudra* who secured Grade-A in ‘CM-AAA’ scheme and also to encourage the entrepreneurs who secured Grade-B in ‘CM-AAA’ scheme for the successful implementation of the Scheme.
4. The Committee recommends to take up a spot visit for identification of suitable land where there is a potentiality of establishing Industrial Hub.
5. The Committee reiterates its earlier recommends for spot visit/tour programme to various Industrial Hubs.
6. The Committee also recommends that the Department should prepare a study report on Industrial policies of Odisha and West Bengal and use them as models for implementing suitable Industrial policies in Assam.
7. The Committee recommends for the establishment of food processing unit & cold storage facilities in every assembly Constituency to promote & support the local farmers.
8. The Committee also recommends that a food processing unit should be established at Sonari LAC under Charaideo district.

9. The Committee recommends that the Department should prepare a blue print of MSME and all the policies framed by the Industries, Commerce and Public Enterprises Department and also promote their policies in National levels for expecting potential investment.
10. The Committee has observed that the Meghalaya Govt. has under taken various initiatives to protect the local business communities from the big business groups.

Therefore, the Committee recommends that the Department should study the policies adopted by the Meghalaya Govt. & consider the similar measures to protect the local business of Assam.

The Committee recommends that the Budget allocation under Grant No. 58 & 60 for the Financial Year 2026-27 for the Industries, Commerce & Public Enterprises Department be approved by the august House.

The Action taken Report on the recommendations may be submitted to the Committee within 90(ninety) days from the date of presentation of the Report in the House.
